### 15/06 Writing and SPAG (Spelling, punctuation and grammar)

These English/SPAG tasks are suitable for all children in Year 3.

Cut or write out the adverbials and sort them into the three types they are. **Step 2:** Then choose 2-3 and use them in some sentences! **Task 4: Using Fronted Adverbials** Since you are an expert, have a go at using fronted adverbials on the below worksheets.

Finally, try where adverbial phrases.

### Task 5: Your Turn!

This week, we would love for you to write about an adventure you had. Perhaps you crept into a dark, deep forest, or maybe you took a rocket to outer space?

Your challenge is to use as many fronted adverbials as you can to start your sentences.






