Bags2School

Next week, you will receive a Bag2School bag with your child. Last year, we managed to raise over £250 via this which helped purchased new ICT resources across the school. This year, the bags will be collected on 13th February but we are hoping

to also sell the clothes after school from Monday 10th February to Wednesday 12th February for 50p to £1 each before sending the rest off to be weighed for collection by Bags2School. If you could kindly bag male/female clothes separately, it would be greatly appreciated. Please come along and see the clothes available. Last year, wet suits, jeans, denim jackets and some beautiful dresses were amongst some bags that split when they were being loaded into the van so you might be able to grab a bargain and help us too.

Census Day

Choir

Choir is changing. From next week, choir will be on a Tuesday morning before school, at 8am, with Sophie Kerslake and myself. Children will be able to enter via the Year 6 patio, straight into Ravens. We are going to start rehearsing for our next major event - Our Junior Music Festival at Queen's Theatre, Barnstaple. Please note that the choir is currently open for Year 3 upwards. Numbers may also be restricted for the Junior Music Festival so commitment is essential.

Attendance

Why is good Attendance important?

Children with good attendance have a better chance of achieving their best and flourishing in school. It builds their self esteem and allows them to make and maintain friendships.

What do we expect at Southmead?

We expect every child to strive to achieve 98% attendance over the year.

Why do we monitor Attendance?

Daily attendance is monitored for safeguarding purposes. If your child is absent and no reason has been given we will call you to find out why they are not in school. This is to rule out something that may have happened on the way to school.

If attendance starts to become a concern there are ways we can help through the School Home Liaison Officer and School Nurse Referrals.

More serious attendance concerns are dealt with by our Education Welfare Officer – Linda Webster. Those with attendance below 90% are automatically referred to the EWO.

What happens when you are Late?

If your child is not in class by 9am they will need to be signed in at the school office. Children arriving after 9am will receive a late mark. Those arriving after 9.10am will receive a U code which means the registers have closed and minutes late after 9.10am will be noted.

What to do in case of Absence? Call 01271 812448 and leave a message on the 24hr absence line. Report the absence via the Southmead App.

What happens when Attendance becomes a concern?

Initial concerns are reported to the Headteacher. Early help includes phone calls/meetings with our Home Liaison Officer and School Nurse Referrals. The Education Welfare Officer is alerted when regular attendance monitoring picks up children with less than 90% attendance.
